Did you know?

- The first computer programmer is widely considered to be Ada Lovelace, who wrote algorithms for a mechanical computer in the 1840s.

- Some of the world's most-used software still contains code written decades ago, quietly running behind newer systems.
- Learning to code often starts with printing the words "Hello, World" to the screen, a tradition followed across nearly every programming language.

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
