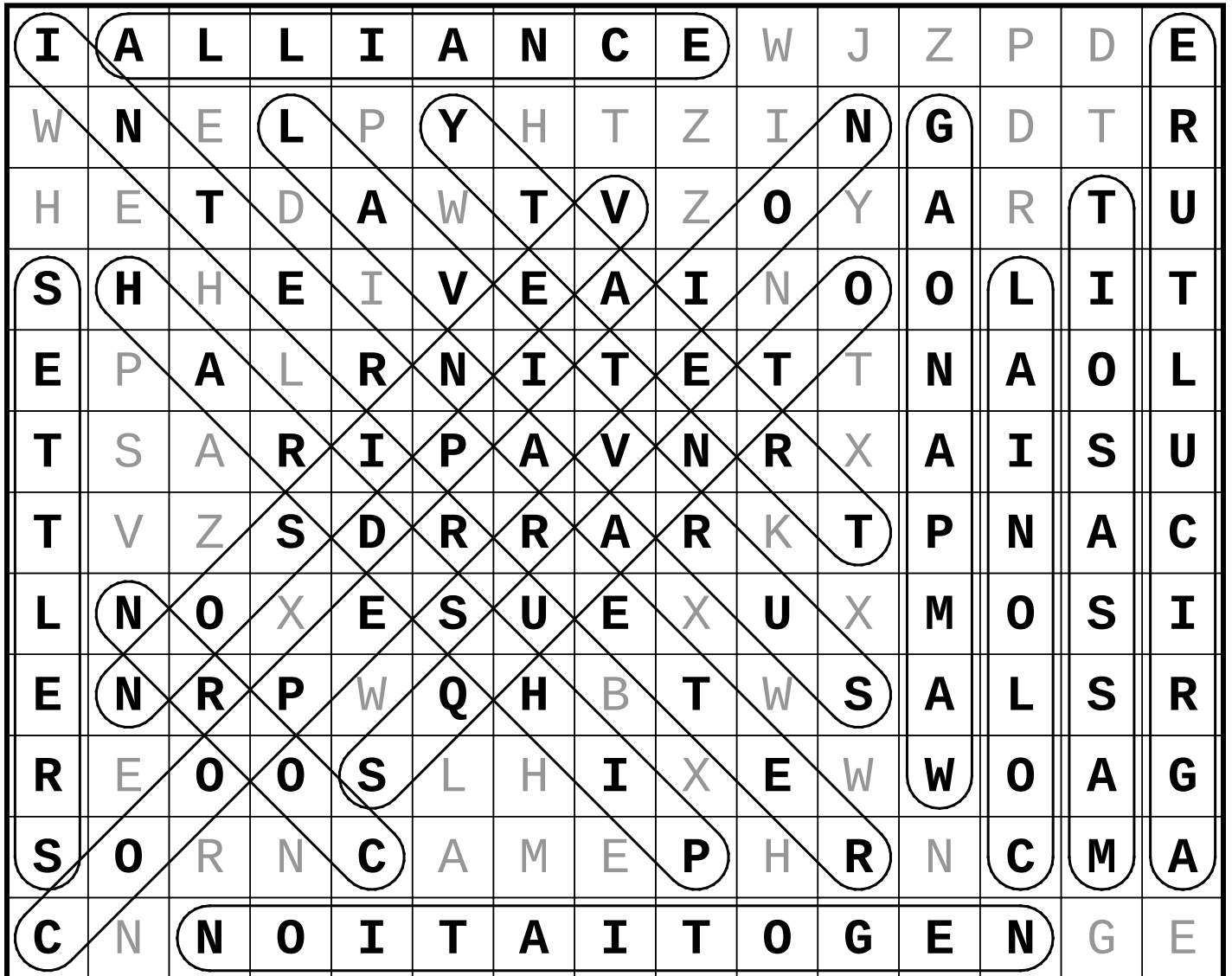

Did you know?

- Historical accounts of the 1621 Plymouth harvest feast come mainly from a small number of surviving colonial writings.
- The event is believed to have lasted several days and included both the English colonists and Wampanoag guests.
- Many foods associated with modern Thanksgiving, like potatoes and cranberry sauce as we know it, likely weren't part of the original 1621 gathering.
- Historians continue to study and reassess the full context and relationship between the Plymouth colonists and the Wampanoag people beyond the traditional story.

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
