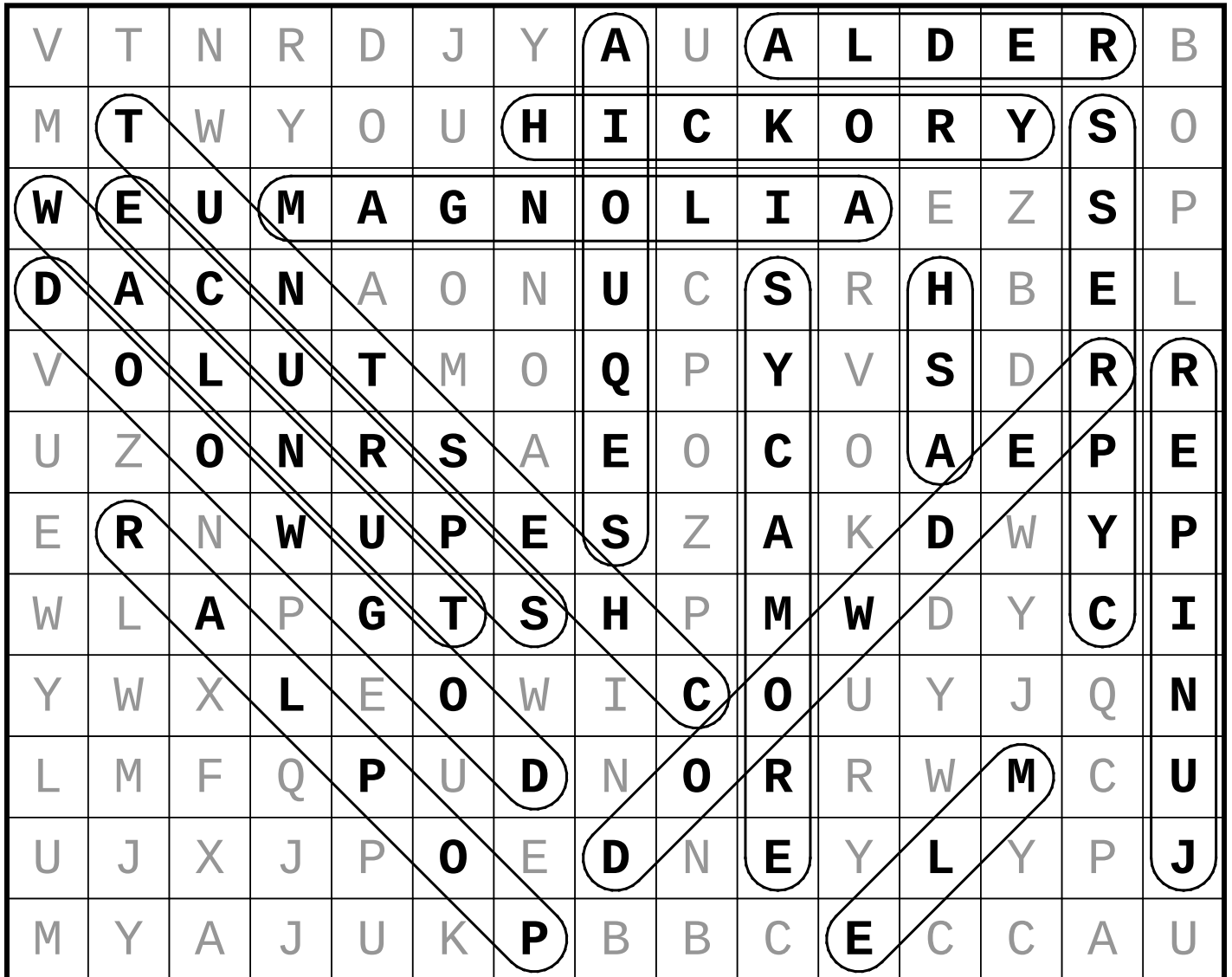

Trees — Answer Key



Did you know?

- A tree's age can often be estimated by counting the rings visible in a cross-section of its trunk.
- Trees can share resources with each other through underground fungal networks connected to their roots.
- Not all trees lose their leaves each year; conifers like pine and spruce stay green through winter.
- The oldest known individual trees are thousands of years old, far older than any human structure still standing.

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
